## **Program Purpose**

▲ The Impact Aid Discretionary Construction
Grant Program provides grants for
emergency repairs and modernization of
school facilities to certain local educational
agencies (LEAs) that receive Impact Aid
formula funds.



Emergency grants are for projects that address urgent health and safety concerns in educational facilities.


## **Program Eligibility**

- ♣ High concentration of federally connected students
- ♣ Free public education
- ♣ No or minimal capacity to bond
- Low assessed value per pupil
- Facility with an emergency condition

## **Project Funding - Amount**



For LEAs with an assessed value over \$25 million, grant funds cannot exceed:

- **▲** 50% of total project cost
- ♣ \$4 million over 4 years

For all LEAs, grant funds **cannot exceed** the difference between the cost of the project and the amount the LEA has available from other sources.





- Repair, renovate, or alter a school facility to ensure the health and safety of students and personnel
- Replacement of a school facility where the LEA holds title and it would be more cost-effective to replace than to repair
- Provide accessibility for persons with disabilities as part of a larger project

## Grant Funds May Not Be Used For...

- ▲ Improvements to school grounds
  - Environmental remediation
  - Traffic remediation
  - Landscaping
- Stadiums
- Teacher housing
- Acquisition of real property
- Maintenance costs



# Build America Buy America ACT (BABAA)

- ▲ President Biden signed into law the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) on November 15, 2021. A component of the IIJA is the <u>Build America Buy America Act (BABAA)</u>.
- ♣ It applies to formula and discretionary <u>infrastructure grant</u> <u>programs funded by the U.S. Department of Education</u> (the Department). BABAA requirements apply to new, non-competing continuation, or supplemental awards obligated under these programs on or after October 1, 2022.

# Build America Buy America ACT (BABAA)



- This program is subject to the Build America, Buy America Act (Pub. L. 117-58) domestic sourcing requirements. Accordingly, grantees and their contractors may not use their grant funds for infrastructure projects or activities unless—
  - (a) All iron and steel used in the infrastructure project or activity are produced in the United States;
  - (b) All manufactured products used in the infrastructure project or activity are produced in the United States; and
  - (c) All construction materials are manufactured in the United States.

Grantees may request a waiver for these requirements, but do not assume a waiver request will be granted when creating your cost estimate.

# BABAA What does "construction materials" mean?

- Non-ferrous metals, such as aluminum, copper, and lead used in a project
- Plastic and polymer-based products, including polyvinylchloride, composite building materials, and polymers used in fiber optic cables
- Prefabricated windows brought to a site for incorporation into a building
- Glass, including optic glass
- Lumber
- Drywall

Construction materials do not include any item that is a "manufactured product"; is primarily iron or steel; or includes cement and cementitious materials, aggregates such as stone, sand or gravel, or aggregate binding agents or additives.



# Application for Federal Assistance

### **Preliminary Documents in Grants.gov:**

Complete the Application for Federal Assistance (Form SF 424) <u>first</u>. (including name, address, e-mail address and organization's UEI number).

- When applying electronically via Grants.gov, you will need to ensure that the organization UEI number you enter on your application is the same as the UEI number your organization used when it registered with the System for Award Management.
- Please do not attach any narratives, supporting files, or application components to the Standard Form (SF 424)

# Part 3: Project Narrative Attachment

- Application Narrative!!!
- A detailed description of the nature and scope of the emergency condition;
- The age and condition of the facility;
- Which mechanical systems are impacted;
- How much of the building is involved;
- The importance of the affected area to the instructional program;
- The population affected (students, teachers, administrators, etc.);

# Part 3: Project Narrative Attachment Cont.

- Application Narrative and Justification for Rebuilding (if proposing complete building replacement)
- The proportion of the building occupants affected by the condition;
- How the emergency condition adversely affects the health, safety and well-being of the occupants of the school facility;
- Any actions the LEA has taken to respond to the emergency condition, and why the applicant has been unable to resolve the condition;
- How the proposed project will address to the emergency condition and the anticipated effect on the useful life of the facility;
- The potential effects of delaying the project, including increased future costs;
- A timeline of major activities such as design, contract solicitation and award, and construction begin and end dates; and
- Other resources available to the LEA that can be used for this project. Include anticipated receipts such as state construction grants, which the LEA has not actually yet received. This information, along with information contained in the LEA's annual financial reports, will be used to evaluate the amount of grant funding.

# Part 4: Construction Program Cost Estimate Table!!!

- The data entered on this table should be based on a recent professional estimate. The estimates should take into consideration the delay between the application for funds and actual construction. Consider that awards will not be made until 6 to 9 months after the application deadline.
- This program is subject to the Build America, Buy America Act (Pub. L. 117-58) domestic sourcing requirements.
  - Requirements can be waived after award, but don't assume a waiver will be granted.

# Part 5: Independent Certification Form

- Applicants must submit a signed statement from an appropriate certifying official
- ♣ The certifying official must either submit a statement on official letterhead or use the sample form located on our website here: <u>Independent Certification Form</u>
- ♣ The signed certification must be uploaded in Grants.gov in a "flattened" (non-fillable, noneditable) PDF format on or before the application deadline. If the **signed** certification is not received by the application deadline, the application may be deemed ineligible.

# Part 6: Annual Financial Report

♣ The Department needs the applicant's Annual Financial Reports (AFRs) from the three most recent fiscal years to verify the amount of available local funds that could be used for this project. Part 7:
Intergovernmental
Review
(Executive Order 12372)

♣ The objectives of the Executive order is to strengthen federalism--or the distribution of responsibility between localities, States, and the Federal government--by fostering intergovernmental partnerships. If this applies to your state you must comply by submitting a copy of your application to your State Educational Agency.

### **Application Tips**




- Only submit one application per LEA/one school facility per application
- Do not submit pictures/maps/diagrams because they will not be reviewed or scored
- Verify Historic Preservation eligibility and requirements
- Feasibility study will be required for new construction proposals
- **▲** You MUST have Adobe Reader installed. <u>Click for more information on Adobe</u>

# Scoring (Subjective)

Review panels of school facilities experts

- Project Need Severity of the school facility problem to be addressed by the proposed project (30 points)
- Project Urgency Risk to occupants if the facility condition is not addressed as soon as possible (28 points)



## Scoring (Objective)



### Effects of Federal Presence

### (30 points maximum)

- Percentage of federally connected children in the LEA (10 points)
- Percentage of federally connected children in the facility (10 points)
- Percentage of non-taxable Federal property in the applicant district (10 points)

### Ability to Respond or Pay

#### (12 points maximum)

- Percent of bonding capacity used (4 points if 75% or greater, 3 points if 50% or greater, etc.)
- Assessed value of real property per student (4 points if in the lowest quartile in the State, 1 point if in highest quartile, etc.)
- Total tax rate for capital or school purposes (4 points if in the highest quartile in the State, 1 point if in lowest quartile, etc.)
