

Definitions



Generally Comparable Districts (GCD): Local Education Agencies (LEA's) that share grade spans, similar average daily attendance, and /or proximity to a large city

Local Contribution Rate (LCR): Rate used in the Impact Aid payment formula to determine payments

Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA): "...a core area containing a substantial population...together with adjacent communities having a high degree of economic and social integration..." - US Census Bureau

Significantly Impacted LEA's: Have at least 50% eligible Federally-connected children or at least 20% eligible Federally connected children in categories A(i), A(ii), B, and C

LCR Options

There are four LCR options

The Impact Aid Grant System (IAGS) chooses the highest rate for which an LEA qualifies.

- One-half of the State average per pupil expenditure for the third fiscal year preceding the fiscal year for the current application.
- One-half of the national average per pupil expenditure for the third fiscal year preceding the fiscal year for the current application.
- The State average per pupil expenditure for the third preceding fiscal year multiplied by the local contribution percentage for that same year.
- The LCR based on generally comparable Districts (GCD)



Grouping and Format

Fiscal Years and Options

- The State Education Agency (SEA) use data from the third fiscal year preceding the fiscal year for the application.
 - E.g., school year 2020-2021 for fiscal year application 2024.
- All LEA's in the State are sorted into groupings base on grade span, size of student population, and location related to an MSA
 - All State funded public school LEA's in the State must be included in the data.
- Significantly Impacted LEA's must be included in the groupings, but their data must not be included in the formulas used to calculate the GCD rates.



Grouping and Format

Fiscal Years and Options

- Option 1: LEAs are grouped by grade span
- Option 2: LEAs are grouped by grade span and size
- Option 3: LEAs are grouped by grade span and location
- Option 4: LEAs are grouped by grade span, size, and location
- Example: K-12, K-12 divided in half by ADA, K-12 divided by inside or outside of an MSA, K-12 keeping the option 2 division and then dividing those two groups by inside or out of an MSA.
- Data must be in an Excel Spreadsheet with formulas calculating the columns and rates.
- The SEA must choose to divide by halves or thirds and only submit the chosen division for Option 2.



Rules

General Rules for Grouping Data

- Each grouping must have at least 10 LEAs after any significantly impacted LEAs are excluded (not removed or deleted) to generate a GCD rate from the grouping.
 - Example: K-6 has 20 LEAs with one significantly impacted LEA.
 When divided by size there are two groups of 10 and the group
 with the significantly impacted LEA will not generate a rate that
 can be used.
- Significantly impacted LEA data must be removed from the formulas after the LEAs are grouped.
 - Example: K-12 has 101 LEAs with five significantly impacted LEAs. When the LEAs are sorted into groups for Options 2 and 3, the grouping takes place and then the formulas are entered or adjusted to exclude the data from the significantly impacted LEAs.



Rules

General Rules for Grouping Data

- The grouping for Option 2 must be equal or differ by one LEA.
 - Example: K-8 has 202 LEAs. For Option 2 the SEA is dividing by thirds resulting in two groups of 67 LEAs and one group of 68.
 The SEA determines which group will have the extra LEA.
- None of the other options require equal groupings.



Regulations

34 CFR Part 222.39

• Title 34 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Part 222.39 contains the regulations for computing GCD rate for LEAs in a state.



Data Submission

Method and Due Date

- The Impact Aid Program sent out a GCD data request to all SEAs in September of 2022
- Spreadsheets will be emailed to the Impact Aid Program at the address, impact.aid@ed.gov
- GCD data must be submitted by November 3, 2023
